"I have attended Department of Anthropology at University of Delhi as a part of the SAAgeNet exchange programme. During my visit, I have supported the fieldwork and explored the availability of data in Cognitive Frailty"

She is a Research Fellow at Lancaster University, UK's International Observatory on End of Life Care. She is the Dowager Countess Eleanor Peel Trust Sir Robert Boyd Fellow, a three-year post-doctoral fellowship awarded to a study titled 'Living and dying in care homes during the COVID-19 pandemic: what worked well and why?' She has worked in IOELC and coordinated the England arm of the EU-funded PACE (Comparing the effectiveness of palliative care for elderly people in care homes in Europe) research program. She coordinated the evaluation of the Manchester Macmillan Supportive and Palliative Care service, where she analyzed routinely collected, longitudinal patient data and secondly conducted and analyzed interviews with patients approaching the end of life and their family carers. During the COVID-19 pandemic, she was seconded to the Cabinet Office as a subject matter expert on adult social care. She was awarded an MBE in the 2022 New Year's Honours list for this work. Her research interests include aging, long-term care, and end-of-life care for older adults. She has 25 peer-reviewed publications and one book chapter.
